



The dotted lines in the above diagram represent a survey made to John Huffman on the 5<sup>th</sup> day of June 1786. The plane lines represent the survey of David Grier made the 13<sup>th</sup> of June 1807. By warrant of the 14<sup>th</sup> of February 1786. That part of the diagram within the dotted line including the letters A.B.C. shows the interference of David Grier with John Huffman. John Martin occupies the part interfering part of Grier's survey under a lease from the owner of Huffmans title, and that part which is clear of interference is in the occupancy of Andrew Fee. Situate in Wheatfield Township Indiana County. Ascertained the said interference on the 24<sup>th</sup> day of November 1827. In pursuance of the several acts of Assembly directing the recovery of the principal & interest due to the Commonwealth from persons holding lands by virtue of Locations or other office titles issued from or under the proprietary Government & by the authority of the Board of Property
