



By Virtue of a warrant from the Hon^{ble} Proprietarys Dated the first Day of November Anno Dom^o 1735 There is Survey'd unto Thomas Heald Three hundred acres of Land with allowance of Six $\frac{1}{2}$ Cent. in Lancast^e County on the West Side Susquehannah River and Begins at a Spanish-Oak by a Small branch Thence South East Two hundred and Sixty $\frac{1}{2}$ ches to a black-Oak Thence South West One hund^d and Ninty five $\frac{1}{2}$ ches and an half to a Post Thence North West Two hundred and Sixty $\frac{1}{2}$ ches to a Hickery Thence North East one hundred and Ninty five Perches and an half to the place of beginning.
