



Resurveyed May 6<sup>th</sup> 1841 for Thomas Snyder the above described tract of Land, containing Seven acres and one hundred and thirty five perches of land and the usual allowance of six per cent for Roads &c., situate now in Mitflin township, formerly Lykens township, Dauphin County; it being a part of a larger tract of land, which was granted to Jacob Herman by his Warrant dated the 14<sup>th</sup> day of October A. D. 1791:— And the said Jacob Herman by his Deed of Conveyance dated the 27<sup>th</sup> day of November 1810; did sell and convey the above small tract of land to Nicholas Snyder, said Deed of Conveyance, being recorded in the office for Recording of Deeds &c. of Dauphin County in Deed Book S, Vol. 1 page 569. Recourse thereto being <sup>had</sup> more fully and at large appears.
