

 Originally Surveyed by John (ob)l. r. syth late D.S. on the (ob)l day of August  
 1790 for Samuel Keller In (ob)l. usance of a Warrant Granted to Nathan  
 Huzzy bearing date the (ob)l day of May 1753. B. Containing 8<sup>25</sup>/<sub>8</sub>  
 64 Perches and allowance Represents part of a larger Tract of 57<sup>5</sup>/<sub>8</sub>  
 & all<sup>ce</sup> of Land, which was Originally Surveyed by the said John For-  
 syth late D.S. on the same day, for said Samuel Keller In pursuance of  
 a Warrant Granted William McMullen, dated the 7<sup>th</sup> day of June 1790.  
 Divided off from the said larger Tracts of Land the 12<sup>th</sup> day of  
 June 1801 for Jacob Keller the present owner who desired me  
 to make Return of the above Draught for Confirmation.
