



By VIRTUE of a Warrant dated the 22^d November 1805 Surveyed the 3^d July 1806 to Jacob Herly the above described tract of land situate in Plainfield Township Northampton County containing thirty six Acres three quarters and the allowance of six & Cent & c^o

Jacob Herly has a house on the land in which his son in law John Wark hiser now lives at the place in the draft marke A & has an Acre or two of land cleared about the house now in Indian corn. The Widow Sywelly has a house on the land in which she now lives at the place marked B. has about three quarters of an acre cleared part of which is now in Rye nearly fit to reap.

Samuel Weinberg has about 20 Acres cleared & in good fence on the land adjoining his other land this land has been cleared by the persons formerly owning his land & by his Tenants some part thereof cleared perhaps 15 or 20 years.
