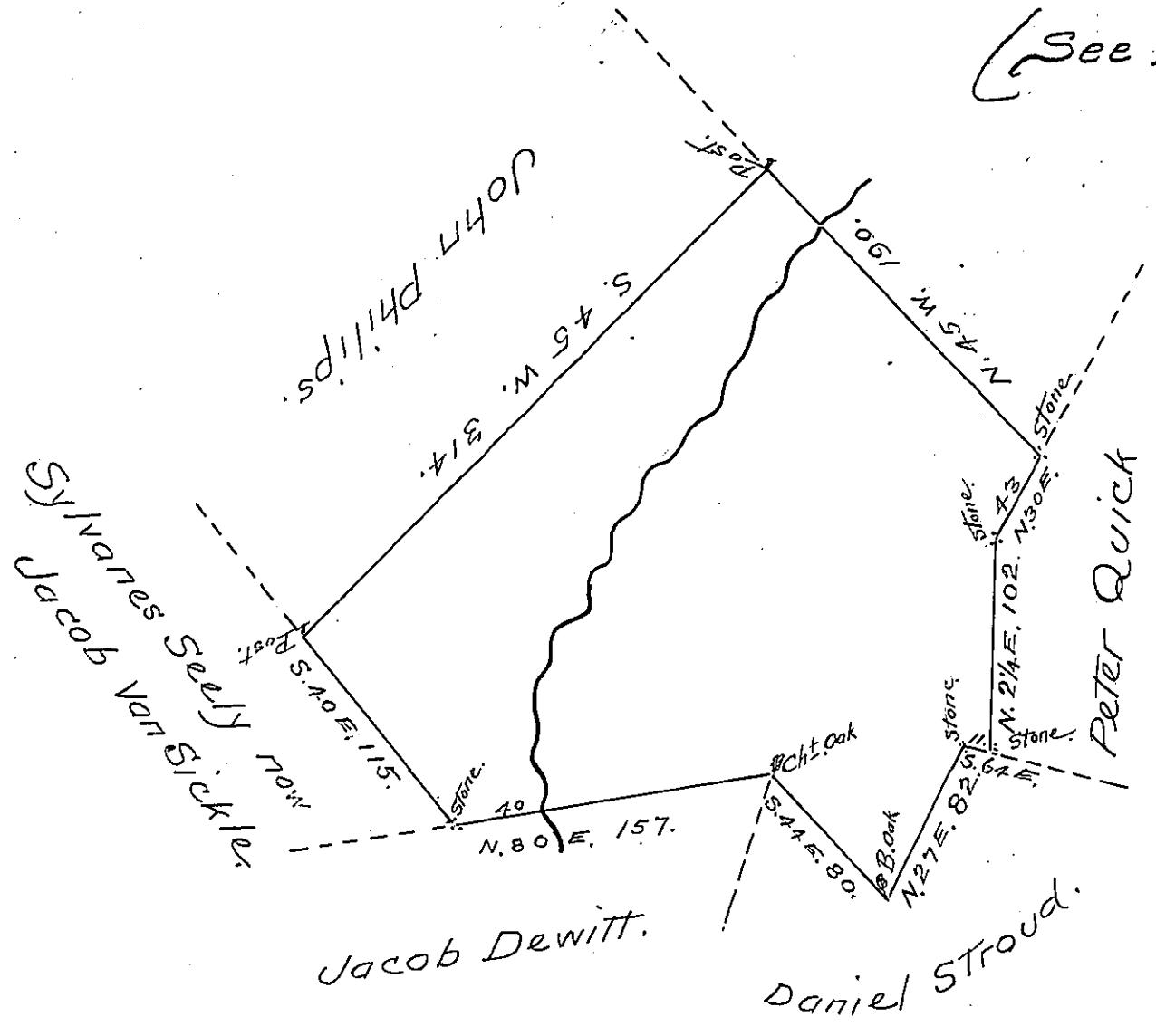

By virtue of a warrant dated the 22<sup>d</sup> day of ~~March~~ <sup>August</sup> 1793 Granted to Isaac Jones, Surveyed the 14<sup>th</sup> March 1815 the above described tract of land (for James Wallace) situate on Dewitts Brook in Upper Smithfield Township (late Northampton now) Pike County adjoining lands granted John Philips, Jacob V.
