By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the Seventeenth day of May 1734. Surveyed to Isaac Maylin, ^{Jun^r} a tract of land situate in the County of Philad^a near Maiden Creek. Beginning at a White oak being a Corner of a tract of land laid out for the Proprietaries use thence by the 5^d land North twenty Degrees West two hundred twenty five Perches to a Post, thence by Vacant land North seventy one hundred fifty Perches Degrees East, to a Post a Corner of Michael Fishers land thence by the same South twenty Degrees East One hundred fifty ^{nine} ~~one~~ perches and the same Course by Vacant land Sixty six perches to a White Oak, thence by Vacant land South seventy Degrees West One hundred fifty one perches to the place of Beginning containing two hundred acres, ^{& 42 Perches} with the usual allowance of six P. Cent
