Surveyd unto W<sup>m</sup> Jackson the 23<sup>d</sup> of the same Month A Tract of land Situate on a branch of Peguea - in Lancaster County. Beginning at a Spanish Oak at corner of Robt Reynolds's Land thence by the same South 40<sup>d</sup> East 140 Pches to another Spanish Oak thence by William Ramseys Land North 70<sup>d</sup> East 16 Pches to White Oak North 53<sup>d</sup> East ten Pches to a White Oak E by N 120 Pches to a White Oak Thence North by West 235 Pches to a Hickery thence South 75<sup>d</sup> West 265 Pches to a Post thence South 59 Pches to a White Oak thence E. S. E 75 Pches to the Place of Beginning. Containing two hundred & eighty five acres and the usual allowance for Roads
