



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietor dated the Nineteenth day of October Anno D. 1737 The above described Tract of land was surveyed Unto Cadwalader Hughes in Gumru Township in the County of Lancaster. Beginning at a Black Oak a Corner of the land of David Jones Thence North 20 degrees East by the same 70 Perches to a Black Oak. Thence South 71 degrees East by Vacant land 40 Perches to a White Oak. Thence South 20 degrees West by the same 139 Perches to a Post. Thence West by ye land of William Jones 113 Perches to a Hickery. Thence North 10 degrees East by a Mountain 44 Perches to a Black Oak. Thence North 65 Perches to a Hickery in David Jones's Line Thence South 71 degrees East along the same 94 Perches to the Place of Beginning. Containing Seventy seven acres Beside the allowance of six P. Cent.
