

 S. 3 1/2 W. 36.9 crossing run at 29.  
 to run 29, - from Run 7.9 to Post.  
 S. 79° 3/4 E. 16.5 crossing run at 58,  
 to run 58, from Run 18.5 to h[ic!] thence by Murphy.  
 S. 11. W. 39.6 to Dogwood.  
 S. 80° 3/4 W. 79. Crossing run at 69.5, to run 69.5  
 from Run 9.5 to Maple Stump.  
 S. 85° W. 29.2 Nearly down the run to B.O. Stump.  
 N. 61. W. 36.8 Dogwood  
 S. 16. W. 20 crossing run at 12. to run 12, from Run 8  
 to Stones (by R. Lyon)  
 N. 14. W. 11.2 post  
 N. 54. W. 44.5 to the Beginning - Containing  
 68° 39' 28 p<sup>s</sup> & allowance.

Situate on the Waters of Little Redstone Creek, in Washington township, Fayette county, and surveyed 21<sup>st</sup> May 1813, in pursuance of Warrant granted to Andrew Hammill dated 2<sup>d</sup> December 1812. Note, there is between 25 and 30<sup>a</sup> of land cleared and in cultivation. And a family residing on the premises.
