



Situate on the North side of the West branch of Susquehanna; about four miles and a half above the mouth of Andersons Creek, adjoining lands of Nun England, Tho. or Da. Liget and others, including an improvement made by W^m Hepburn since May 1807, in Clearfield County, Chinciclamoose township, Containing four hundred and nine Acres, and One hundred and fifty seven perches and allowance for roads &c.

Surveyed the 10th of August 1811, for W^m Hepburn in pursuance of a Warrant dated the 4th of June 1811, Nº 6031.

At the time of making the above Survey, the above named W^m Hepburn & family lived on the ground.
