



Situate on the North side of the West branch of Susquehanna; about four miles and a half above the mouth of Andersons Creek, adjoining lands of Nun England, Thos. or Da. Liget and others, including an improvement made by W. Hepburn since May 1807, in Clearfield County, Chincliclamoose township, containing four hundred and nine Acres, and One hundred and fifty seven perches and allowance for roads &c.

Surveyed the 10th of August 1811, for W. Hepburn in pursuance of a Warrant dated the 4th of June 1811, Nº 6031.

At the time of making the above Survey, the above named W. Hepburn & familie lived on the ground.
