



November 27th 1839 Surveyed the above described piece of land for William Hall in pursuance of a Warrant dated the 29th day of October 1839 and granted to him for two acres of land situate in Robison Township Allegheny County Containing within the black lines Two Rods and eleven perches "neat measure"

Note, the small piece marked A. Contains two $\frac{1}{2}$ perches and has part of a log barn on it belonging to the Representatives of And^{rs} McFarland. and the part marked B. embraced by the dotted lines D. E. is embraced in a field belonging to the said McFarlands representatives. But I believe neither of the pieces is claimed to be within the McFarland Survey
