



By Virtue of a Warrant dated the 25th of March 1822 Surveyed the 8th of May 1822 to George Hess (by order of George Palmer) the above Described two Tracts of Land Situate partly in Lower Mountbethel - and partly in upper Mountbethel Townships in the County of Northampton. the one Tract Containing thirteen acres and fifty perches and the other four acres and forty four perches and the allowance of Six per Cent &c. When the Warrant was Taking It was not Known that Crawford's Old Survey Divided the Vacant, the Warrant was Intended for the whole

When the Land Was Surveyed It was on improved as far as I can find out, a few year - after the Survey was made George Hess built a Small House on the 4th 44 and Leres in the House now with his family, and has the Mount Cleared and in fence, and on the 13th 50 hath been Cleared a few acres last year, and now Sowed with grain. february the 17th 1840
