



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Hon<sup>ble</sup> Proprietaries Bearing Date the 27<sup>th</sup> Day of November 1739  
Surveyed to James Hutchenson A Tract of Land in the Township of Donegal Beginning at a  
Birch tree (obl) side of Sickasalunga Creek thence South 11 Deg West 103 per to Black Oak thence Sou-  
th East by South 30 per to a Hickory thence (obl) past by North 228 per to a Hickory thence North by West  
17 per to a Black Oak thence East 10 1/4 North 115 per to a Black Oak thence North 82 Deg  
West 177 per to a Hickory thence North 13 Deg West 24 per to a Hickory thence West 40 per  
to a post thence North 29 Deg West 28 per to a Spruce Growing By the side of Sickasa-  
lunga Creek thence Down the Several Courses of the Creek 102 perches to the place of  
Beginning Containing One Hundred & fifty nine Acres of Land with the usual Allowan-  
ce of Six Acres P Cent for Roads &c Surveyed March the 21<sup>st</sup> Anno Dom 1739 8/9
