



A Draught of a Tract of Land Called \_\_\_\_\_ situate on the Southerly side of the North East Branch of Susquehannah River, on Tunkhannock Creek, about seven Miles from the Mouth, including a Spring, in the County of Northumberland adjoining Land surveyed to Thomas Fleming, Containing three hundred & forty six Acres and a half, besides the usual allowance of 6 p Cent. for Roads &c. Surveyed the 24th. day of August 1774 for Joseph Beavers, In pursuance of an Order Dated the 28th. day of July, 1769, No 3692.
