



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated September the Third 1734 Surveyed unto Jacob Hill a Tract of Land Situate in Maxetawny in the County of Philad^a Beginning at a post a Corner of Peter Wentz's Land thence by the same South twenty Degrees East Two hundred and sixty perches to a post thence by Vacant Land South Seventy Degrees West Seventy perches to a Black Oak Sapling thence by Vacant Land North twenty degrees West one hundred and thirty four perches to a post thence by Vacant Land South Seventy degrees West one hundred twenty five perches to a post thence by Vacant Land North Twenty degrees West one hundred twenty six perches to a White Oak thence by Vacant Land North Seventy degrees East one hundred Ninety five perches to the place of Beginning containing Two hundred Acres with the usual Allowances of Six Percent - Surveyed September 15th 1734
