



Draft of a tract of land situate in the Township of Union on the waters of Hunlocks creek adjoining John T. Miller, H. S. Butler and others, containing fifty three ³ acres and one hundred and fifty perches and alle of Six pr. Ct for roads. Surveyed the above described tract of land the 27th day of August 1868 for "Samuel Hunlock" in pursuance of a Warrant to John Koons dated the 13th day of March 18¹⁸, said Hunlock has lived upon the lot since 1820 and it ^{was} conveyed by John Koons to Jonathan Hunlock by deed dated 12th of January 1819 and deeded by said Jonathan Hunlock to Samuel Hunlock the present claimant by deed dated 26th of May 1835, as will more fully appear by the "records" of Luzerne County.
