 In pursuance of a Warrant for 30<sup>95</sup> Granted to James  
 Jacobs & John Moore Executors of the last Will and Tes-  
 tament of David Pugh Deceased in trust for the use of the  
 Heirs of the said David Pugh Deceased bearing date the 19<sup>th</sup>  
 day of March A. D. 1812. N. B. The improvements at the time  
 of the above Survey consisted of part of a meadow and  
 two cleared fields, the building consisting of an old dwel-  
 ling uninhabited and had gone into decay - And now on the  
 27<sup>th</sup> day of January 1819. at the request of Christopher Stickle  
 the present owner the same has been calculated examined  
 and found to be correct and at his request I am desired  
 to make return of the Draught for Confirmation.
