



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietor Dated the 12th Day of October Anno Dom. 1737 The above Described Lott was Resurveyed unto Grace Lloyd Situate in the Borough of Chester Beginning at the Lott of Joseph Parker Thence North Seventy Two Degrees East by the Street Next the side of the River Delaware Forty four Perches and Twelve feet to the Back Street Thence North Twenty Six Degrees West by the same Eight Perches and four feet to the Lott formerly of John Hoskins Then South Seventy two Degrees West by the same Forty Four Perches and three feet to the Lott of Joseph Parker Then South Twenty two Degrees East by the same Eight Perches and three feet to the place of Beginning Containing Two acres & forty ^{Two} ~~Three~~ Perches
