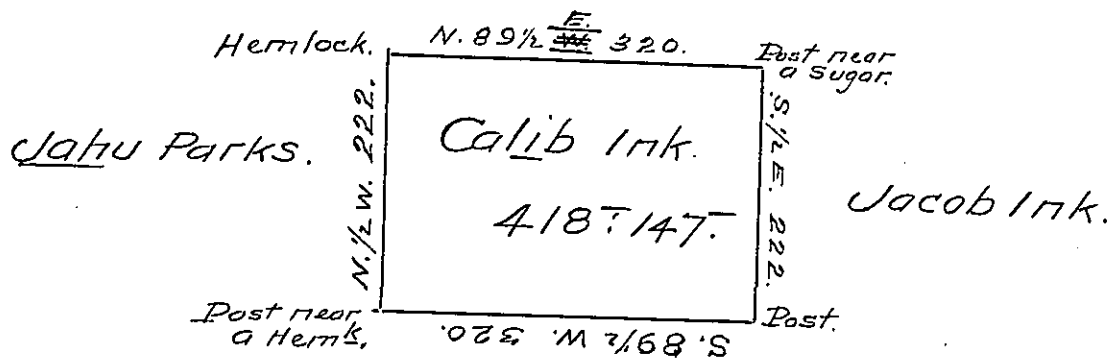

Situate on the waters of the east branch of French Creek in District No. 1 surveyed the 4<sup>th</sup> day of June 1799 in pursuance of a warrant in the name of Calib Ink dated the 10<sup>th</sup> day of April 1793 and a warrant of the Surveyor Genl. (upon an order of the Board of Property) Dated the 16<sup>th</sup> of May 1799. Containing four hundred & Eighteen acres & one hundred & forty seven perches & the allowance of six per cent
