



By Virtue of a Warrant Dated the 5<sup>th</sup> of October Anno Domini 1743. The above Described Two Tracts of Land was surveyed to Martin Kersner in Bern Township Lancaster County, viz: One of them. Beginning at a post at a corner of Stephen Bright's Land. Thence South 35 Degrees East by said Kersner 36 perches to a post thence South 61 Degrees West by Vacant Land 54 perches to a Spanish Oak thence North 35 Degrees West by Conrad Kersner 36 perches to a post in Steven Bright's Line. Thence North 61 Degrees East by the same 54 perches to the Place of Beginning. Containing Nine acres beside Allowance & c.

Another Addition Begins at a Chesnut Oak. Cor. of 59 Kersner thence North 60 Degrees East by the Line of Nicholas Reem 72 perches to a White Ok. thence North 31 Degrees West by Vacant Land 96 perches to a Chesnut Oak thence North 77 Degrees West by Do. 86 perches to a Black Oak thence South West by the same 21 perches to a Black Oak thence South 35 Degrees East Vacant Land and said Kersner's 150 perches to the Place of Beginning. Containing Fifty Nine acres beside the usual Allowance for Road and Highways
