



By Virtue of a warrant granted to Thomas Kearns dated the 30<sup>th</sup> day of May, 1754. Surveyed the 19<sup>th</sup> day of December, 1793, for Christopher Kearns the above described tract of land situate in the Township of Tulpehocken, now Upper Tulpehocken Berks County, Containing twenty eight acres and ninety seven perches & allowance. Resurveyed a part of said 28<sup>acs</sup> & 97 perches for George P. Spangler containing five acres two perches & allowance of six per cent for Roads &c.
