



By Virtue of a warrant from the Proprietaries dated the fifteenth day of July 1734 Surveyed unto John Conrad Behme a tract of Land situate in Oley in the County of Philad<sup>a</sup> Beginning at a post in a line of Anthony Morris's Land, thence by the same South South West forty seven perches and by Vacant land the same Course sixty three perches to a Chesnut, thence by Vacant land North West Two hundred and Twelve perches to a post thence by Vacant Land North East one hundred and twenty perches to a post, thence by Vacant land South East Two hundred and Twelve perches to the place of Beginning Containing one hundred and fifty acres with the usual allowance of six P. Gent.
