



In Pursuance of an Order from the Commissioner of Property dated the 16<sup>th</sup> day of June 1772 a Survey was made on the 3<sup>d</sup> July 1772 for Alexander Emmans on a certain Lot of ground situate in the Town of Sunbury in the County of Northumberland marked in a general Plan of said Town Number Two hundred and thirty five, Containing in Breadth East and West Sixty feet, and in Length North & South Two hundred and thirty feet. Bounded Northward by Blackberry Street, Eastward by Lot Number Two hundred and thirty four, Southward by Gooseberry alley, and Westward by Lot Number Two hundred and thirty six.

Returned into the Secretary's Office the 14<sup>th</sup> day of May 1776 for Adam Miller.

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this Sixth day of October 1905.
