



A Draught of a Tract of Land Situate about two Miles beyond Conestogoe Creek in the County of Lancaster Containing One hundred and fifty nine Acres and the usual allowance of six Acres  $\& C^t$  for Roads  $\&c^a$  Surveyed to Martin Mire (al<sup>s</sup> Maier) by Warrant of the 22<sup>d</sup> day of April 1734 (The Right whereof is now Vested in Christian Maier Eldest Son of the said Martin Maier by his having Secured to the other Children their Shares according to the direction of act of General Assembly of this Province for Settling Intestate Estates) Returned into the Secretarys Office the 19<sup>th</sup> day of September Anno Domini 1749.
