To Daniel Brodhead Esquire for Alexander M<sup>o</sup> Glean Deputy Surveyor Generale

Note, this Survey was Caveated by Thomas Jones, the trial was put off until May or rather June 1788. when the Board determined in favor of Andrew Linn with respect to this Survey. ~ I was present and the Surveyor General marked the decree of the Board on the plan I had made for Representation, this Return is in Consequence thereof and agreeable thereto. ~
