



The above is a draught of a survey made in pursuance of a warrant granted to Joseph Harshey for 2 acres of land improved bearing date Jan<sup>y</sup> 11<sup>th</sup> 1848 but contains 1 acre and allowance surveyed Feb<sup>y</sup> 10<sup>th</sup> 1848 situated in Amwell Township Washington County Pa the warrant calls for Bear & Baker adjoiners those men once adjoined but Gittings has purchased land on all sides

Note This land was improved some 30 or 40 years since, and transferred passing through a number of hands lastly purchased by Lilburn Gittings who rented it to Joseph Harshe, Harshe after living for a number of years on the land as a tenant of Gittings applies and gets a warrant and has the survey made Gittings now contends for the land and is about to bring a court action to hold the land.
