



The draught of a tract of land called Hickory-Hill situate along the top of an high ridge or precipice nearly between and back from where Samuel Crooks and one Meades lived in Augusta township in the County of Northumberland containing one hundred sixteen acres fifty two perches with usual allowance for roads surveyed the 14th day of December Anno Dom 1774 in pursuance of a warrant from the Honble proprietaries to William Macloy bearing date at Philadelphia the twenty fourth day of December Anno Dom 1773
