



By Vertue of a Warrt from the Proprietaries dated the 23<sup>d</sup> of March 1736, for 200 acres. Thomas Morgan's Land situate upon A Branch of Conestogoe Creek, in the township of Carnarvon, in the County of Lancaster, in the Province of Pensilvania.

Begins at A Maple tree Standing about thirty four perche Eastward from the said Creek; thence North sixty seven Degrees West by Vacant Land one Hundred and Eighty seven perches to A white oak saplin; thence North twenty three Degrees East by Vacant Land one hundred and four perches to A Black Oak Saplin; thence North Eighty Seven Degrees East By Vacant Land one hundred and Eighty five perches to a post, thence South fifteen Degrees West by Vacant Land one hundred and Eighty four perches to the place of Beginning. Containing one hundred <sup>8</sup> sixty three acres, Survey'd March the 28<sup>th</sup> Ano Dom 1737 containing 154 a. s. & Allowance &c.
