



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the 23<sup>d</sup> day of October 1733. Surveyd unto John Moyer & Michael Moyer a Tract of Land in the County of Lancaster. Beginning at a post at a Corner of George Aston's Land thence East 5. East by the Land of Jacob Gritor 58 pches to a White Oak, thence 5.64<sup>d</sup> East by Andrew Hamilton's Land 214 pches to a post thence North 15<sup>d</sup> East 442 pches to a Black Oak, thence W. by S. by Vacant Land 300 pches to a Black Oak, thence South 15<sup>d</sup> West by Vacant Land & Land of the 5<sup>d</sup> George Aston 260 pches to the place of Beginning. Containing five hundred & fifty Six Acres and the Allowance of Six  $\frac{1}{2}$  Cent.

Surveyd the 2<sup>d</sup> November 1733.
