



In Pursuance of a Proprietary Warrant dated the Fourteenth day of June Anno Domini 1737
 There was surveyed on the first Day of July then next ensuing unto John Miley a Certain Tract of Land ~~of~~ situate in the County of Lancaster on Cocallico Creek.
 Beginning at a marked Maple Tree by the Side of the same Creek, Thence extending by Land of Andreas Knopf West 66 pches to a Post. Thence by Land of John Showanour North twenty four Deg^s and a half East 80 pches to a white Oak, North 102 pches to a hickry and North forty Deg^s West 72 pches to a hickry, Then by Philip Traut's Land North seventy five Deg^s East 50 pches to a post, and North fifty five Deg^s East 118 pches to a post. Then by John White's Land South 40 1/2 pches to a Post and East 13 1/2 p^s to a post. Then by the Lands of Martin Funk and John Bowman respectively South seventeen Deg^s East 124 pches to a White Oak. Then by SA-Bowman's Land, South fifty Deg^s West 52 pches to a post and South ten Deg^s East 72 pches to a white by the Side of the said Creek, Thence down the same Creek 113 pches to the place of Beginning. Containing 180 Acres and an Allowance of 6⁰ Ct for Roads &c.^a Surveyed the 1st Day of July A^o Dⁱ 1737.
