



By Order of the Proprietary Surveyed to James Mitchel A Tract of Land in the Township of Donegal in Lancaster County. Beginning at a Corner Black Oak in the line of John Stewarts Land, thence by the same South 57 deg. East 154 per to a Black Oak corner of Nathaniel Little's Land, thence North East by East 272 per to a hickory, thence South 36 deg East 142 per to a post, thence North East by East 105 per to a Black Oak, thence North 11 deg East 103 per to a Marked Birch By the side of little Chickasalunga Creek, thence North 34 degrees by North West 170 per to a post, thence South 66 deg West 270 per to a Black Oak corner of John Galbreath's Land, thence South 55 deg West 249 perches to the place of Beginning. Containing five hundred & Sixteen Acres with the Allowance of Six Acres <sup>as</sup> per cent for Roads &c. Surveyed April ye 8<sup>th</sup> 1736. By Sa:-Blunston. —

The 100 <sup>as</sup> was granted to James Mitchel by Deed from James Logan part of 2400 <sup>as</sup> granted to James Steel by Warrt dated the 26<sup>th</sup> of March 1733 in right of W<sup>m</sup> M<sup>r</sup>ham one moiety of wh<sup>t</sup> James Steel granted to James Logan.
