



By Virtue of a Warrant Dated y<sup>e</sup> 23<sup>rd</sup> of March Anno Domini 1742. The above Described Tract of Land was Surveyed to John McFarson in Sadsbury<sup>n</sup> and Chester County y<sup>e</sup> 14<sup>th</sup> of April Anno Domini 1743. Beginning at a post by William McKnight "South 3 degrees West by Matthew Wood 162<sup>n</sup>, thence South 31 Degrees West 56 perches To a Black Oak, thence North 87 Degrees West both by Robert Pater's Improvement 38 per. to a Black Oak, thence North 78 Degrees West by D<sup>o</sup> and the Improvement of James Walker 30 perches to a Chesnut, Thence West North West 68 per to a White oak, thence, North North East 36 perches to a post, thence North 72<sup>d</sup> West 39 per. to a White Oak, Cor. of Jon. McFarren, thence North N. West by D<sup>o</sup> 65 per to a Black Oak, thence South 85 Degrees West 4 perches to a Black Oak Cor. of Adam Leech, thence North 5 Degrees West by 5<sup>d</sup> Leech 57 per. to a Black Oak, thence N. 88<sup>d</sup> E. by D<sup>o</sup> and John Williams 146 per. to a Black Oak, thence East North East 40 per to a Hickery Cor. of Wm McKnight, thence E. by S. 43 per. to y<sup>e</sup> Place of Beginning &c. Containing Two Hundred and fourteen acres beside the Allowance of Six <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> Cent for Roads and High Ways.
