



A Draught of a tract of Land in Greenfield township Erie county on the waters of Lake Erie Surveyed the 20<sup>th</sup> day of October 1801 for Alexander Lowery by virtue of his Actual Settlement, and Resurveyed the 23<sup>d</sup> day of September 1802 in pursuance of a Warrant granted to the said Alexander Lowery dated the 26<sup>th</sup> of March 1802. Containing 404 and an half Acres and Allow<sup>ce</sup> It being the Same tract of Land which was said to have been surveyed on a Warrant dated the 13<sup>th</sup> day of April 1792 granted to William Smith on condition of Actual Settlement and improvement whereof Default hath Occurred.
