John S. Woodward and Alexander Clark Esq<sup>r</sup> and the original surveys of  
Joseph Dunlap and Robert Cooper being the Western part of the same tract  
of land which was surveyed to Christopher McMichael and James Clark  
in pursuance of two warrants, one of which was granted to Christopher  
McMichael and the other to James Clark, the latter is dated Augt  
24<sup>th</sup> AD 1786 and appears to have been intended for the part of the  
land above represented by the draught.
