



A draft of a tract of land called—Situat joining Land surveyed for Isaac Hill & others including some of the Head branche & part of Run the empties into the E. branch of Susqu<sup>a</sup>—on the easterly side nearly opposite Sheshequenunck in Luzerne (late Northumd) County. Containing three hundred & sixty seven acres  $\frac{1}{4}$  & allowance of Six P. Cent for Roads &c. Surveyed for Timothy Matlack the 10<sup>th</sup> day of October 1786 in pursuance of a War (obl.) dated the 27<sup>th</sup> day of April 1775. and an order of the Hon<sup>e</sup> Bd of Property dated the 9<sup>th</sup> day of Feby 1784.
