Note, the Return of the above survey, was delivered by me to John Barran on or about the 27<sup>th</sup> Day of August 1793. he being the Chief Clerk of the Surveyor Generals Office, but it appearing that the same is not to be found filed in said Office, a demand was made upon me by the commissioners appointed under the Act intituled ~~an~~ an Act for the more speedy and effectual collection of certain Debts due this Commonwealth, in pursuance of the Sixth Section of the supplement to the said Act, passed March 19, 1807. to make return of the same. John Nicholson being interested in the same.

William P. Brady being duly sworn according to Law, doth declare, & say, that he made the survey as above returned, and that the facts above set forth are true.
