



By Vertue of a Warrt from the Proprietaries dated
the 11th. Day of June 1734 Surveyd unto Jacob Button a
Tract of Land situate in New Cowissiopen in the County of
Bucks & Part in the County of Phila. Beginning at a Post
in the German Line being a Corner of Geo. Shoemakers Land
thence by the same North East one hundred and fifty five Per-
ches to a Post, thence by vac. Land and South East fifty two
Perches to a Hickry Sapling, thence by vac. Land south eighty
two degrees East thirty six Perches to a Black oak Sapling, thence
by vac. Land South East eighty four Perches to a Post, thence by
vacant Land South West one hundred and seventy seven
Perches to a Post in a Line of y^e said German Tract, thence by
the same North West one hundred and sixty four Perches
to the Place of Beginning, Containing one hundred & sixty
two Acres with the usual Allowance of 6 & C^t.
