



Surveyed to John McGlaughlin 22nd of April 1840. the above described piece of land containing twenty nine acres and thirty four perches and allowance Situate adjoining his other land Robert McGlaughlin land belonging to William Herrons heirs, John Jameson and (little) John McGlaughlin in Brush-valley township Indiana County. By Warrant of 30th of March 1840.

N.B. Robert McGlaughlin caveats the above Survey alledging the right to the land vested in him. but not having an interview with himself I do not know his plea. he was absent when I made the Survey and I was from home when he sent his plea verbally by his wife.
