



A Draught of a Tract of Land called the Sleeping Place Situa (obl.) on the old Road leading from Stony Creek to Keckeny pawlings Old Town including the first Spring which crosses the said Road beyond (obl.) Creek about two Miles beyond said Creek & on the Waters of it adjoining Lan (obl.) of Samuel Dougal Benjamin Hogeland & Frederick Sheets in Brothers Valley Township in the County of Bedford Containing three hundred and thirty five Acres and the usual Allowance of Six p. Cent for Roads &c. Surveyed the 4<sup>th</sup> Day of May 1770 for George Scholfield in pursuance of an order N<sup>o</sup> 2896. Dated the 7<sup>th</sup> Day of April 1769. by
