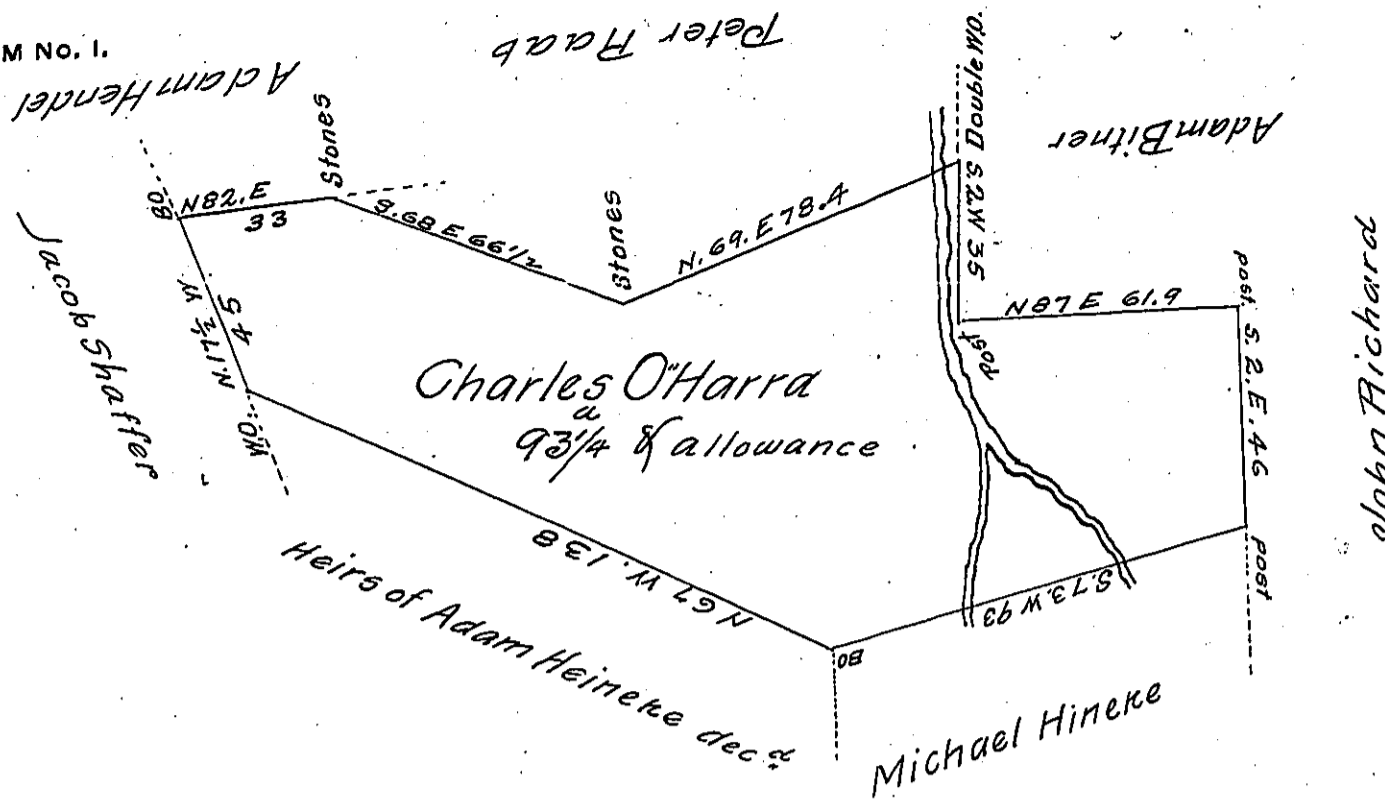


FORM NO. 1.



A Draught of part of a larger Tract of Land situate in York Township in York County. Resurveyed the 2^d day of March 1797 by the lines formerly run by William Matthews late Deputy Surveyor in pursuance of a Warrant to Charles O'Harra dated the 13th day of December 1751 being part of a larger Tract by me lately returned on the said Warrant to Raab & Hinecke.

N.B. - The said William Matthews had surveyed Two small Tracts & I think returned both on a part of the land, but afterwards surveyed the whole on O'Harra's Warr^t as being the oldest Title. One of those Tracts called Noisy hill containing 73^a & 13^{ps} & allowance is in R^t of Jacob Baker by application dated the 23^d September 1767. The other Called Deep Hollow containing 38^a & 113^{ps} & allowance by appⁿ to Adam Hinecke dated the 21st day of September 1767. William Matthews in running his last survey on O'Harra's Warrant (of which the above is a part) had mistaken a course which occasioned the resurvey of the whole tract.

This survey I suppose is by him returned into the Surveyor Generals Office by the name of Batchelors Hall and is recorded 174 acres & 70 perches
