



Begining at a black oak standing in Gorge Packman's Land line, then North by the said line one hundred and twenty four pearches to a hickry then West one hundred and eighteen pearches to a post in an old line then South ten pearches by the same to a black oak then West forty pearch. to a Whit oak by an old line then South one hundred and thirty pearch by Vacant Land to a post then East Eighty eight pearch by Joseph Souders land to two small black oaks, then North eighteen pearch to a post, then East ^{twenty} seventy pearch to the place of Begining. Containing one hundred ~~thirty~~ ^{thirty} one acres and an half & allowance surveyed to Crestan Newcumb on the 17 day of the same month in 1734, upon the head branches of Sockcurk in Bucks County, By
