



In Pursuance of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the sixth day of November A<sup>d</sup> Di. 1734 surveyed unto George Priegel, A Certain Tract of Land. Situate on a Branch of Tulpehocken Creek, Called the Mill Creek in the County of Lancaster. Beginning at a post a corner of John Sells's Land in a Line of David Jones's. Land thence extending by said Sells's Land North East by East half a point Easterly, One hundred and sixty three pches and a half to a marked black oak at another corner of s<sup>d</sup> Sells's Land thence by Vacant Land North, North-West half a point Westerly one hundred and twenty five pches to a post in a Line of David Evans's Land, thence by the same and Vacant Land south West by West half a point Westerly one hundred and seventy six pches to a post; thence by Vacant Land and s<sup>d</sup> David Jones's Land, South East by East One hundred twenty five pches and a half to the place of Beginning. Contain- ing one hundred and twenty five acres and an allowance of six p. Cent for Roads & ca. Surveyed the 22<sup>nd</sup> day of October A<sup>d</sup> Di 1735.
