



A draught of ten acres & twenty nine perches of land, Strict or Nett Measure. Situate in Decatur township, Mifflin County, (it being a part of a tract of land, which appears to have been surveyed the 16th day of August 1803, in pursuance of a Warrant to James M^cDowel-dated 18th July 1795, and contains 274^{ac} 16^p & the allowance of Six percent for roads &c.) The above was laid off the 1st of October 1830 for W^m Brown & Jacob Sigler, - Brown having sold the same to-Sigler both present.
