



Jacob Shilling in R<sup>t</sup> of Van Swearingham by Order of - N<sup>o</sup> 2852, dated April 3<sup>d</sup> 1769. Surveyed August 31<sup>st</sup> 1770.

I have late found this draught among my Brother Arch<sup>d</sup>'s papers whither a proper return has been made or not I cannot tell, but I see <sup>it</sup> interferes with the Land now returned to Eli Allen. please take such Order thereon as the honorable board may think proper, as I can give you no further Information respecting it.
