Originally Surveyed by Charles Lukens late D.S. on the 24<sup>th</sup> day of April A.D. 1766. In Pursuance of a Warrant Granted to John Pike dated the 4<sup>th</sup> day of December A.D. 1762. The above resurveyed and divided (part) from the said larger Tract of Land on the 12<sup>th</sup> day of March A.D. 1811. at the request of the owner Moses Pike who desired the same to be returned for Confirmation.
