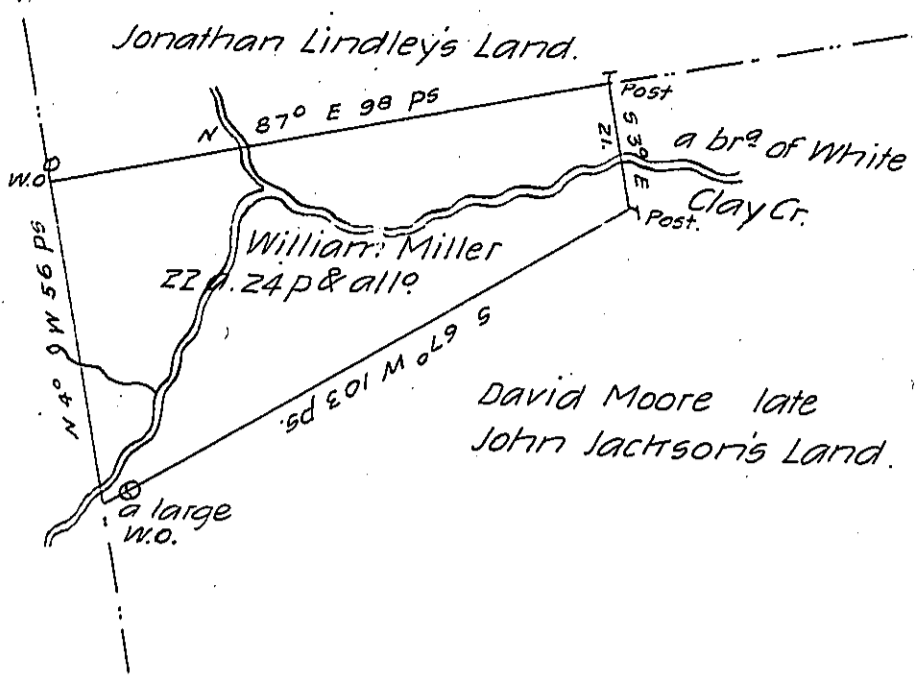

Cent. And there appears to be no house nor buildings on the said land, it is mostly cleared and about Three acres of mowable meadow and a piece of an orchard there on, the soil is thin and under its present circumstance may phaps sell for about Thirty Shillings P. acre.
