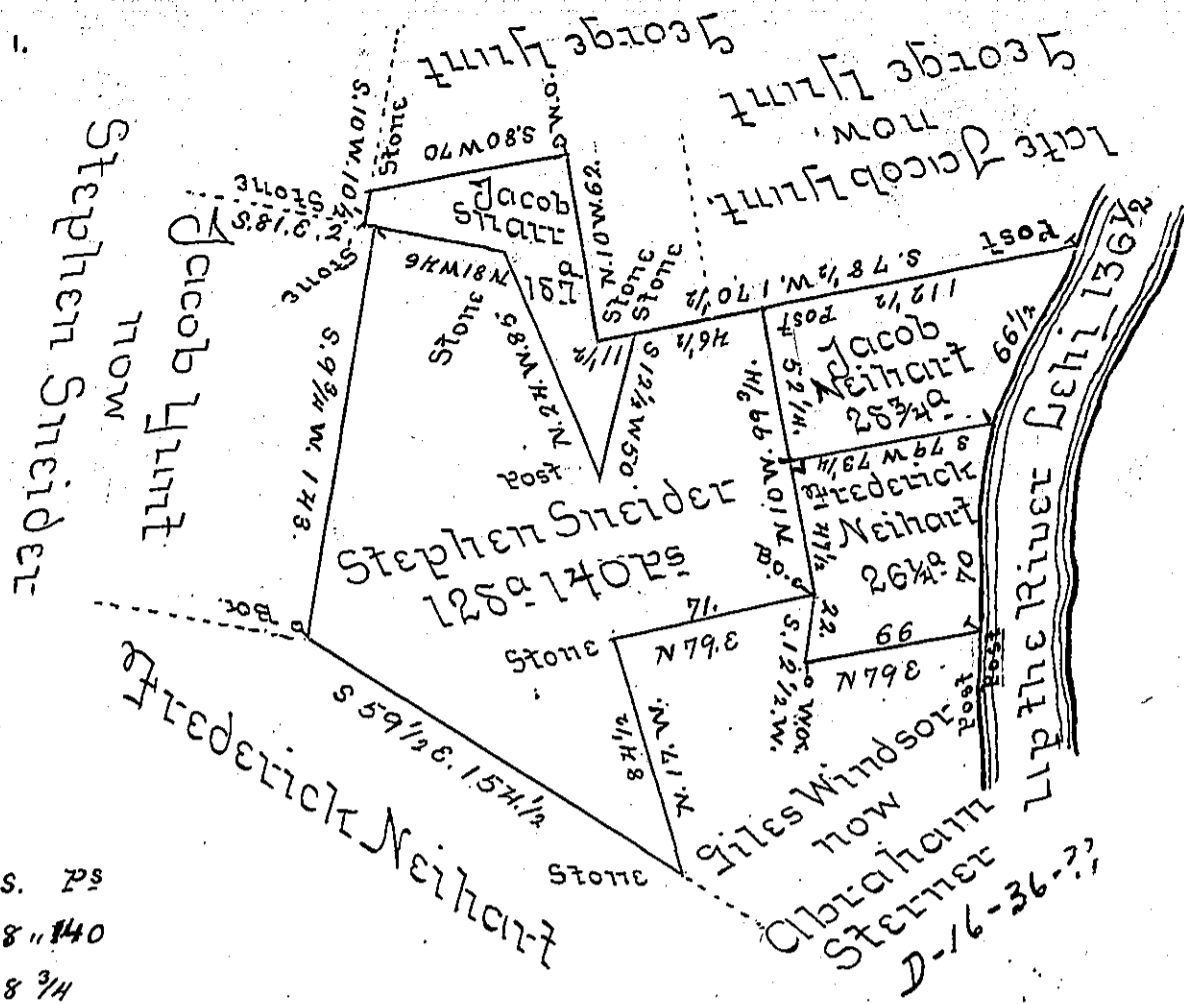

By Virtue of three Warrants and an Application one of the Warrants granted to Jacob Neihart dated the 23<sup>d</sup> May 1751 one other Warrant granted to Frederick Neihart dated the 22<sup>d</sup> April 1752 the Application granted to Jacob Snarr dated the 11<sup>th</sup> June 1766 and the other Warrant granted to Stephen Snieder dated the 26<sup>th</sup> April 1766 Surveyed the 12<sup>th</sup> & 13<sup>th</sup> June 1766 to Stephen Snieder the above described <sup>four</sup> tracts of Land Situate in Whitehall Township Northampton County Containing Altogether Two hundred and one Acres One hundred and forty seven perches and the Allowance of Six PCent & c<sup>a</sup>
