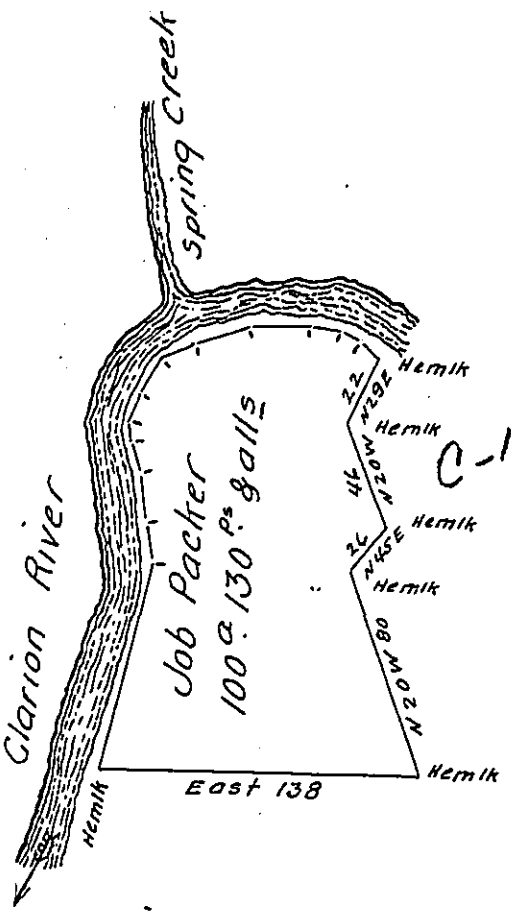

The above described tract of Land Containing One hundred Acres and One hundred and Thirty Perches and Allowance of Six per Cent for Roads &c. Situate on the South Side of the Clarion River. Opposite the Mouth of Spring Creek in the last Purchase made of the Indians East of the Allegheny River and Conowango Creek in Ridgway Township in the County of Jefferson. By Virtue of a Warrant granted to Job Packer for 100^{ac} dated at Harrisburgh the 6th of January A. D. 1837.
